A special meeting of the Council of the Borough of Minersville was held June 17, 2020 via telephone conference call due to the Covid19 Virus social distancing rules. President Milbrandt opened the meeting with The Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance:

Mr. Kuehn made a motion, on the recommendation of Police Chief Combs to approve Lazarchicks to operate a curbside café, providing they have appropriate insurance and have applied to PLCB for a temporary extension of their liquor license. Mr. Darosh seconded the motion.

Ms. Newton made a motion, second by Mr. Firestine to approve any other businesses to operate curbside providing they have adequate insurance and if serving liquor have applied to PLCB for a temporary extension of their liquor license. Mr. Firestine seconded the motion.

Police Chief Combs informed the Council that a request to hold a peaceful demonstration. Chief Combs suggested they use Memorial Park. Ms. Newton had concerns that it would dishonor veterans. Chief Combs will respond to the request and inform council of their intent via email. Mr. Umbenhen stated that should Memorial Park be used, the flags be removed prior to the demonstration.

Solicitor Evans stated that waivers concerning COVID are recommended but are not needed to open the pool.

Mr. Darosh made a motion, second by Mr. Firestine, to adjourn.
